This matter comes before the Court by way of the Supplemental Declaration of Joseph M. Alioto filed on July 3, 2019 (the “July Declaration”). According to counsel, the July Declaration was submitted in order to correct inadvertent omissions from an earlier Declaration by Mr. Alioto that was filed in support of a motion seeking Mr. Alioto’s admission *pro hac vice*. See ECF No. 874. The Court had granted the unopposed *pro hac vice* motion on June 27, 2019.

In the original Declaration in support of the motion, Mr. Alioto declared as follows: “I am not under suspension or disbarment in any jurisdiction or court, and no disciplinary proceedings are pending against me and no discipline has previously been imposed upon me in any jurisdiction or court.” ECF No. 861-1 at ¶1. However, in the July Declaration, Mr. Alioto details four separate occasions during the period 1987 to 2011 where he has been subjected to discipline by the California Bar or federal courts. ECF No. 874-1 at ¶¶ 3-6.

As the July Declaration makes clear, the Court and the parties did not have all relevant information in connection with Mr. Alioto’s *pro hac vice* motion prior to the motion being decided. Therefore, the Court will renew the motion and reconsider its earlier decision granting Mr. Alioto’s *pro hac vice* admission after all parties have been given an opportunity to be heard. Accordingly,

IT IS on this 9th day of July 2019

ORDERED that the Order at ECF No. 871 is hereby VACATED; and it is further

ORDERED that the Clerk is to reopen the motion for *pro hac vice* admission at ECF No. 874 and set the motion for the next available motion date (August 5, 2019); and it is further

ORDERED that any opposition to the motion is to be filed by July 22, 2019.
